The Rise of Anti-Semitism: A World-Wide Phenomenon

On Friday, December 7, the City Club of Cleveland featured Dr. Gunther Jikeli, who gave a data-driven talk about the rise of anti-Semitism in Europe and the U.S.

Dr. Jikeli, a historian and sociologist of modern Europe with an interest in the history of anti-Semitism, is currently a visiting associate professor at Indiana University in Bloomington. In 1990, there were 190 anti-Semitic attacks in Western Europe and the United Kingdom. Last year in the UK alone there were 1,400 incidents, 200 of which were of a violent nature. Only 25% of the attacks were reported to the police. In the U,.S., anti-Semitic violence has not been a major factor until the incident at the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh, where 11 Jewish members were killed by a terrorist.

This antagonism toward Jews comes from the Far Right, the Far Left, and radical members of the Muslim community, the latter residing primarily in France and Germany. In Great Britain, anti-Semitism (or at least anti-Israeli rhetoric,) resides in trade unions and the Labor Party of Jeremy Corbin.

The rise of right-wing populist parties in Poland, Hungary, Austria and Germany pose a further threat to Jews. In Germany, there is a revisionist movement of history that minimizes the Holocaust. In the Muslim world, those who hold to Sharia law (not man-made law), fundamentally oppose the existence of a Jewish state. Although members of this group represent a minority of Muslims, their voices--like those of the Muslim Brotherhood-- are among the loudest.

Free speech advocates support the right of these groups to voice their opinions, but free speech should not allow for slander and violence toward others. Another danger, Dr. Jikeli pointed out, is that these radical positions toward Jews can drift and make their way into mainstream thought.
